Presidents Report – Spring General Meeting

The golf course board has been busy over the winter working to improve everyone's experience at the Yellowknife Golf Club. I have summarized below some of the items from the end of last season.

Club Car Service Contract

At the end of last season, we negotiated a Service Contract with Club Car to complete pre-season service on our carts as well as an end of season service before the carts are put away for the winter. This contract has already served its purpose as we started the 2018 with all thirty-eight carts fully operational and did not have any batteries that need to be replaced.

Tee Boxes

In 2017 we applied for and received a \$10,000 grant from the City of Yellowknife to replace Tee Boxes on the golf course. This included smaller design that will be lower to the ground for easier access. The new Tee Boxes will also use an advanced turf that is designed to accept a tee with out having to use sand. This material is used on driving ranges in the South, so it will have much better durability than the old materials. Most of the Tee Box structures have been built, you may have already noticed them on the course. We have received a \$5,000 grant from the city in 2018 to expand the Tee Box project. While most of the Tee Boxes will be replaced, there will be several new Tee Boxes to give us separate White & Red Tee boxes. Once the Tee Boxes are complete we will make arrangements for Golf Canada to visit and reassess our handicap ratings.

Grass on Hole 2

Over the last few seasons we have unsuccessfully tried to rejuvenate the grass around the second hole. This year we will be installing sod once the weather cooperates and we can get the irrigation system running. When the sod is laid down we close hole 2 and setting up a temporary hole for a couple weeks to allow the sod to take hold. Conditions permitting, the sod will be in place and the hole opened before the Midnight Classic.

Honours Board

We have struggled with ways to display our past tournament winners. Thanks to an idea and donation from a member, we are in the process of creating an honours board that will be mounted on the wall to display our champions. The list on the board will commence at 2010 as we do not have accurate records before that point.

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Kitchen Repairs and Clubhouse

Prior to the opening of the clubhouse this year, we completed updates to the Kitchen. These updates include installing a three-bay commercial sink, new countertops and cupboards around the sink. We also made some temporary repairs to the flooring to pass our health inspection. We were fortunate that the Health Inspector allowed us to open with the temporary repairs when we committed in writing to completely replace the flooring in the kitchen area at the end of the season.

The Clubhouse and Kitchen area are in need of renovation and updates. This summer we will put together a plan including a budget to invest Capital to renovate the Clubhouse. Items that will be looked are; kitchen updates including service area and bar, carpeting in the dining area, window replacements, air conditioning, new doors. We also will assess the condition of the roof to determine when we need to plan for replacement of the roof.

Alcohol Prices

For the first time in many years we have had to raise alcohol prices at the Yellowknife Golf Club. The main reason for the increase is to offset the extra labour costs with the raise of minimum wage by \$1 per hour in the Northwest Territories.

We apologize that we do not have the reviewed 2017 financials available yet as we have had to change our accountant to Avery Cooper and they are not available until early June. We have sent the required information and can update the membership once received. We finished the 2017 fiscal year with a NOI of roughly \$8,000. This was due to restraint on capital as well as control on cost vs. revenue. Matty was diligent in keeping us on track for a successful 2017. For 2018, we have budgeted some improvement in revenue and plan to focus on some capital improvements to tee boxes and aprons. We will also be working on touching up the clubhouse near the end of the season.

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General Managers Report – Spring Meeting

Firstly, I would like to welcome everyone back to another Golf Season at the Yellowknife GC, I hope everyone had a great winter and are ready for a summer of golfing. Its great being back in Yellowknife now that the weather is finally making a turn for the better.

Pro-Shop:

90% of our merchandise is now in the shop and just waiting on a few items to come in but should be fully stocked come June 1st for our busy time.

You will notice some familiar faces and some new faces in the Pro-Shop this summer, Cole Marshall is returning this year and will be taking the lead on managing the Pro-Shop and Driving Range over the summer. New into the shop this year we have River Sleno working full-time, Sebastian Toner and Connor O'Brien part-time. We have a great team this year in the Pro-Shop, and these guys are here to service your golfing needs for the summer.

Grounds & Maintenance:

This year we have Jeremy Grayston returning to the Grounds & Maintenance crew and he is joined by Carson Othmer and Jean-Luc Amirault. We are aiming to have the water system up and running for the week of May 21st with Canadian DeWatering coming in to do our opening season servicing on the irrigation system pump.

JMS Services have been in over the past week power raking, punching and fertilizing our aprons, they have said the amount of dead thatch that they have been removing is the most they have ever seen. This is a great sign, as means that the grass is healthy and had a good year of growing. We may have to look to complete this process mid-season again if we have another strong year with growth.

We have a fair bit on the go for Grounds & Maintenance this year with the work of completing the new tee-boxes out on the course. We have 10 new tee-boxes that will have a new T-Line turf, these tee-boxes are aimed to be completed in the next couple weeks and will complete 5 more by the end of the summer.

Clubhouse:

This year we have employed new chef's, Angus Durrie has joined the team as Head Chef and brings some new and exciting ideas to the Yellowknife GC. He is joined by newcomer Patrick O'Connor and returning from a few seasons back we have Heather Redshaw. For those that have tried the food already this season you will notice the improvements in the quality of food that is coming out. The first week we have had nothing but compliments on the food being served. There is a large focus on everything being made in house, all our salad dressings, mayonnaise and sauces are homemade. We have a fresh new team of servers for the season, be nice to them as they learn the ways of the Yellowknife GC and get to know everyone names.

You may notice that we have some new flag poles on the roof of the clubhouse, we purchased a new "ring" system to try and combat the issue of the flags tangling. Time will tell if we are successful.

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Membership:

Membership prices didn't change again for the 2018 season and currently we have 193 Members signed-up as of May 18th 2018, I would like to see us get to 325 members by the first week of June. We are at 9 new members so far.

As many of you may have noticed, when you sign into your Golf Canada account it will prompt you for some information up-dates, this is because we have upgraded to Gold Membership with Golf Canada. Gold Membership has some added benefits to last year's bronze account, with lost club stickers, club insurance and a few other new features. We will receive all our membership packages mid-June and will send out an email to remind everyone to collect them.

Corporate Tournaments:

As we get closer to June, we start to prepare for the corporate tournaments for the season, we have an event planned on every Friday until August with most of these events being 18-hole golf and banquet meals. These events are Food & Beverages main source of revenue, and generate a large portion of the GC's yearly revenue.

We are hoping to pick up 4-5 smaller events and or government awards throughout the season and plans are being worked on for these golf days.

I look forward to servicing the membership for the 2018 season and wish everyone a great golfing year. And as always the Yellowknife GC team is here to help you with all your golfing needs that you may have.

Position Overview

The Golf Course Development Committee is responsible for playability and long term planning for the Yellowknife Golf Club. Playability can be defined as allowing a high handicapper a reasonable opportunity to get around the course. An ideal design should be playable but provide interesting challenges to all.

Committee or Individual Responsibility Areas (either committees or individuals will be assigned responsibilities in the following areas understanding that communication will be required through the tournament committee as overlap in some duties will occur)

In concert with the Golf Club Manager, determine a long term development goal for the Golf Course.

Identify Capital Planning for short, medium and long term goals

Work with Grounds and Maintenance Committee to execute long term and playability goals

NOTE: these terms of reference are not intended to be all-inclusive. Director may perform other related duties as required to meet ongoing volunteer needs.

Committee report for May 18th 2018

So far, Justin Bailey has recruited 4 members to assist with recommendations on course playability for a wide variety of handicaps as well as the female player aspect. I believe it is extremely important to get more female golfers involved in regular play as well as tournaments. I believed that gaining more input on how to make the course a little friendlier would increase the players on a regular basis as well as tournaments.

Sub Committee Members include: Steve Norn (6-10 handicap) Chris Lafferty (11- 20 handicap) Winter Haley (20-30 handicap) and Jenni Bruce (30-40 handicap). The committee will be meeting for the first time on May 19th and a meeting with Matt will be booked shortly after.

Topics and strategies being discussed

- Washroom facility cleanliness
- Building up gravel in front of elevated greens to allow the ball to roll up onto the grass or green to assist golfers who don't hit as far.
- Cleaning up shrubs in front of tee boxes
- Volunteers and possible contractors to donate some time
- New tee boxes being put in
- Possible water hazard on 18
- Clean up for members around personal cart areas
- Future ideas...

I believe that we have an eager group and will hopefully be able to gain some volunteers to assist with items approved by the Manager.

This coming season has an exciting atmosphere to it. The course is in great shape thanks to the hard work of our dedicated staff.
